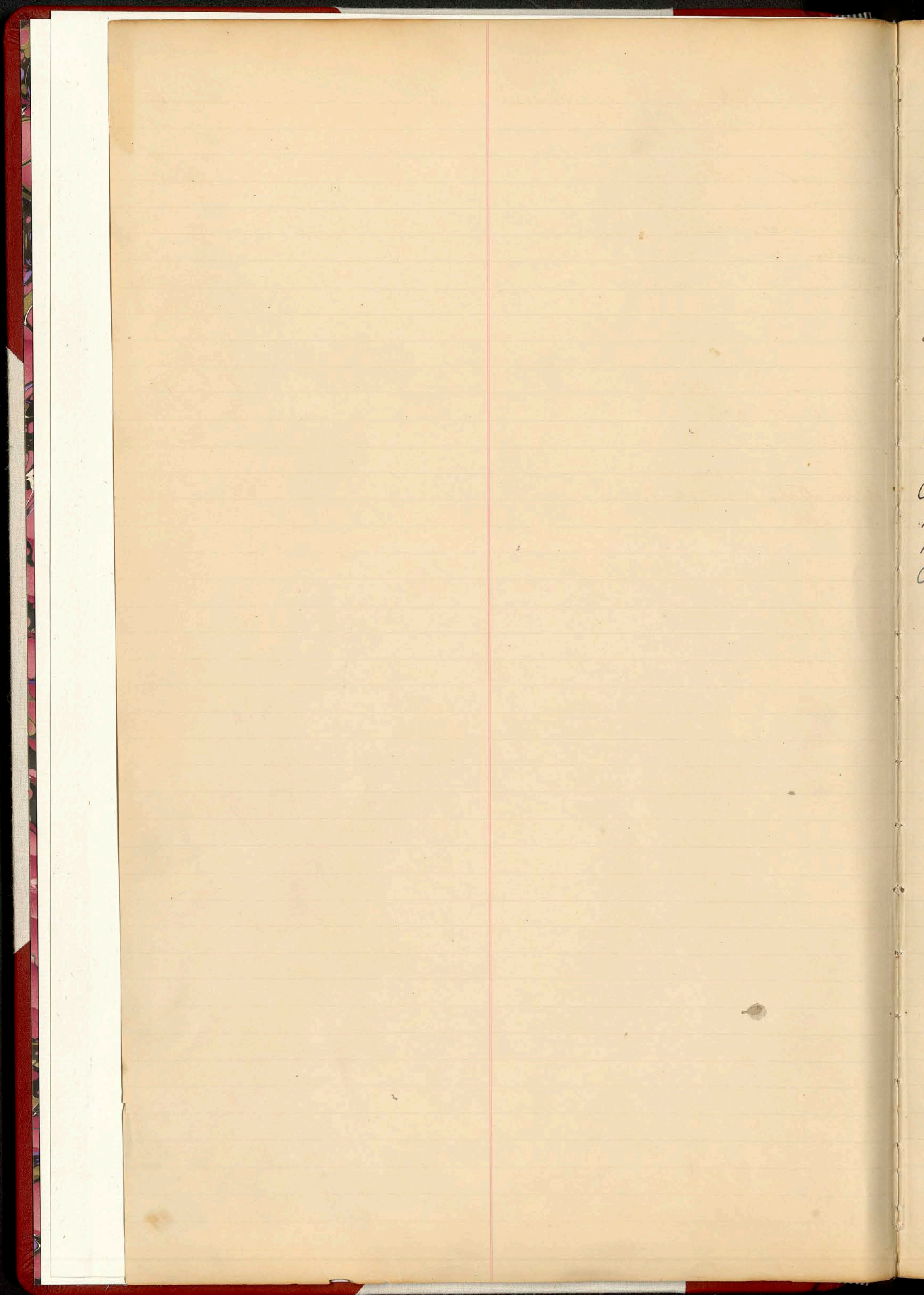

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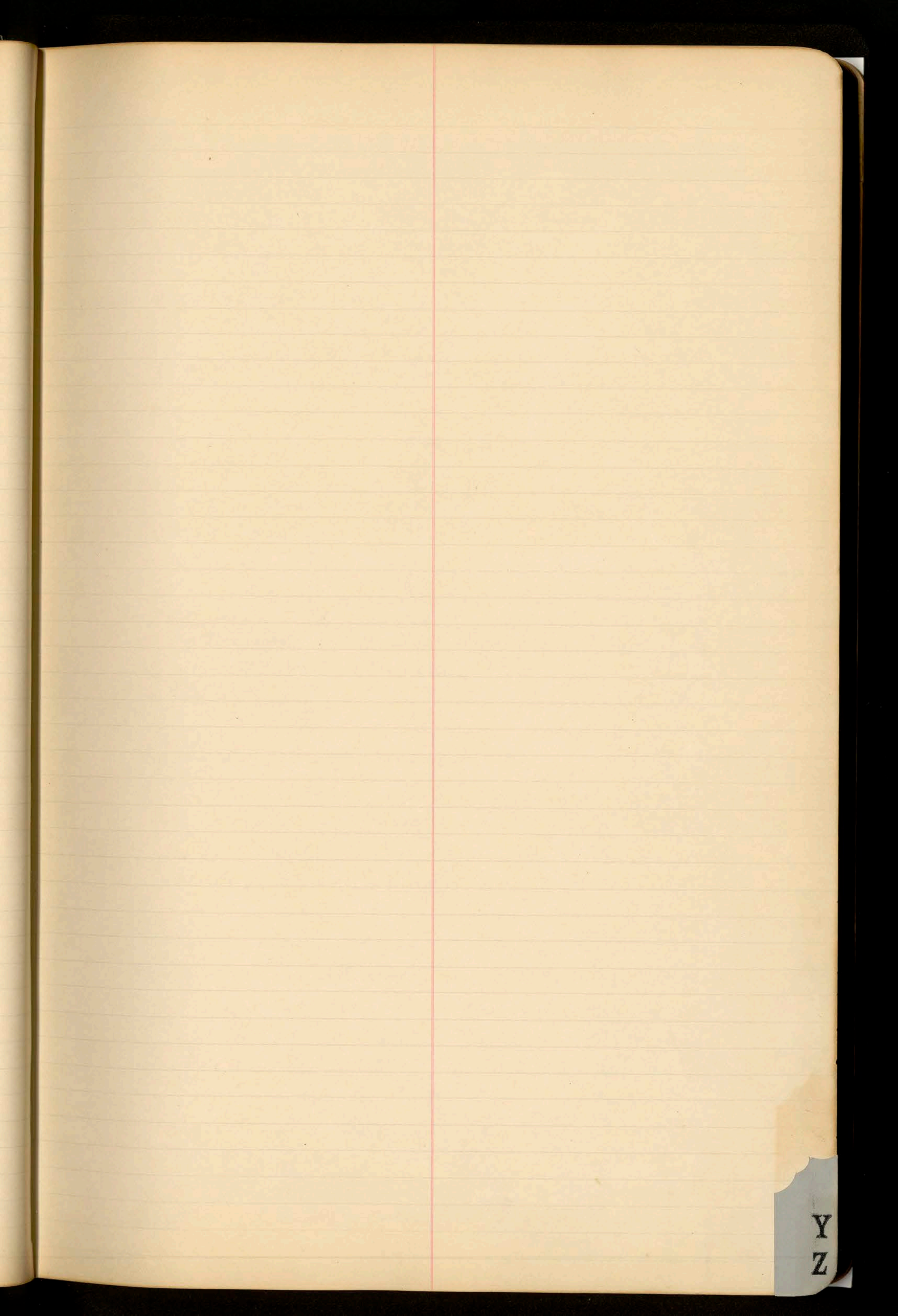

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Declaration For Domestic Trademark
To All Whom It May Concern.
Be it known, That L. Philip H. Gerhard, a
citizen of the United States, residing at Austin,
in the County of Travis, and State of Texas, have
adopted for my exclusive use, a trade-mark
for asbestos and generators or apparatuses
for generating gas, and desiring to establish
a record date of the adoption and use of
said trade-mark, I hereby file this decl-
aration for record, in the miscellaneous
book in the office of the County Clerk of
Travis County, State of Texas. The essential
features of my trade-mark consist in the
representation of a crown, upon the band
of which is inscribed the word "Formal-
dehyde". The said trade-mark was first
adopted by me on or about the first day
of July, A.D. 1903. And has been used con-
tinuously in my business since that
day. As aforesaid, the general class of
goods in connection with which this
trade-mark is used is asbestos and
generators or apparatuses for generating
gas, and the particular description of
goods in such class on which I use the
trade-mark is chemically prepared
asbestos and generators or apparatuses
for manufacturing formaldehyde
gas. It is my practice to apply the said
trade-mark to the goods by printing
it directly upon some conspicuous
part thereof, or printing it upon a
label and pasting the label upon the
goods. I also use the trade-mark on
my stationery and for the purpose of
advertising my goods in the public press
of the country, and in any other way

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legitimately calculated to give warning
to the public against possible infringe-

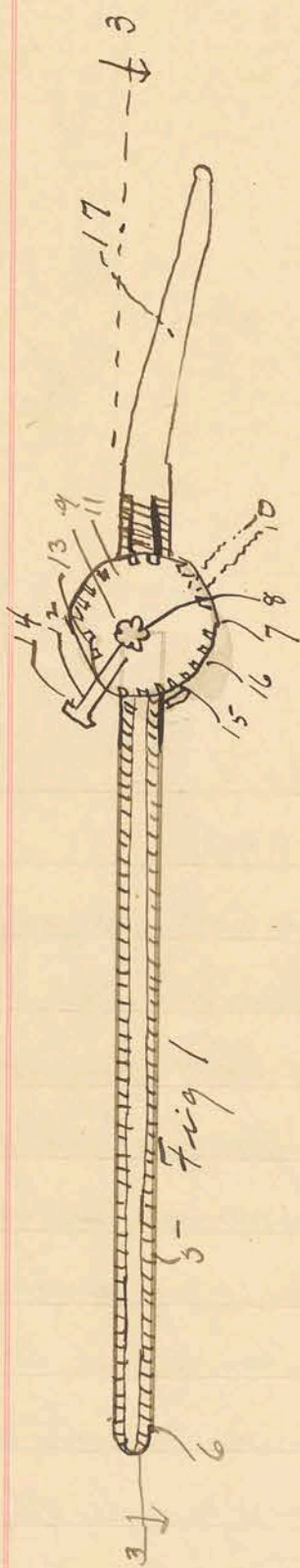

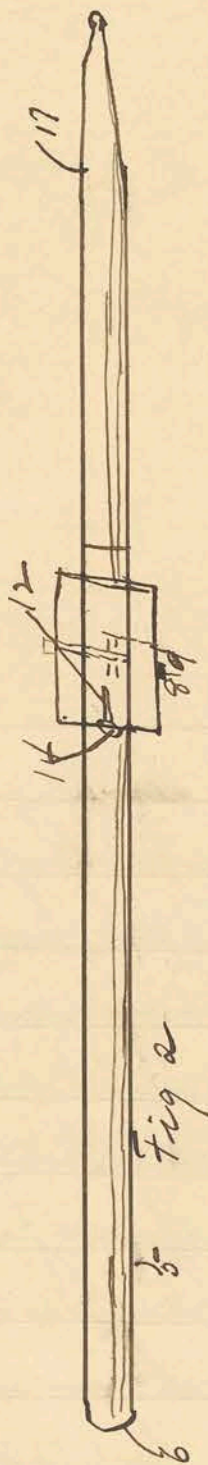

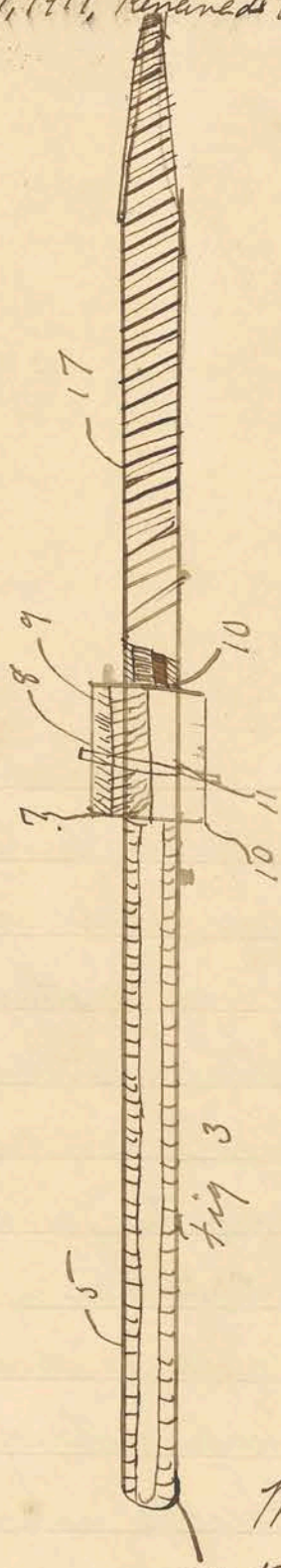

To all to whom it may concern.
Be it known that I, Walker G. Edwards, Jr. citizen of the United States, residing at Austin, in the County of Travis and State of Texas, have invented certain new and useful improvements in Dental Implements of which the following is a specification.
This invention relates generally to dental implements, and particularly to a plugger. The primary object of the invention is to provide a tool for use by dentists in filling teeth, and which is adapted to contain a number of pieces of filling material ready for instant discharge into the tooth being filled. A further object of the invention is to provide a tool of this character provided with a storage magazine for fillings, and which is capable of being actuated so as to discharge the fillings from the magazine one at a time. A still further object of the invention is to provide a tool of the character mentioned in connection with a plugger, whereby the two instruments are combined into one, thus obviating the changing of implements after depositing the filling in the tooth and before the plugging operation.

A still further object of the invention is to provide a tool of the character set forth which shall be of extremely simple and inexpensive construction, which is composed of but few readily-assembled parts, all so constructed and arranged as to minimize the opportunity for weakness or breakage which is positive and easy in operation, and which is thoroughly efficient in practice.

With these objects in view together with others which will appear as the description proceeds, the invention resides in the novel formation, combination, and arrangement of parts, all as will be described more fully hereinafter, illustrated in the drawings and particularly pointed out in the claims.

In the drawings:—

Figure 1 is a longitudinal sectional view taken through a tool constructed in accordance with the invention.

Fig 2. is a top plan view of the improved tool and Fig. 3 is a transverse sectional view taken substantially upon line 3-3 of Fig. 1.

Referring now more particularly to the drawings, 5 indicates a tubular shank having one end slightly reduced and open as at 6, and being enlarged at its opposite end to provide a chamber 7. The tubular member is preferably straight and may be of any desired length and diameter and the chamber 7 is substantially circular.

Rotatably mounted on a suitable axle 8 extending laterally and centrally through the housing or chamber 7 is a cylinder 9, the latter being of slightly less diameter than said chamber. This cylinder communicates at its periphery with the inner end of the tubular member 5, and the said periphery is provided with a plurality of spaced pockets 10, which are adapted to be moved into register with the tubular member one at a time. The cylinder is equipped with a ratchet wheel 11, the teeth of which are engaged by the inner end of an operating rod 12. A spring 13 normally holds this rod retracted from the ratchet teeth and the outer end of the operating rod is provided with a knob 14 to be depressed by the finger. It is obvious, therefore, that when it is desired to rotate the cylinder, the knob may be depressed and this action causes the rod 12 to engage one of the ratchet teeth and to rotate the cylinder 9 a degree equal to the distance between the spaced pockets 10 in the periphery of the cylinder. Immediately upon the release of the knob, the spring 13 will retract the rod, so that the inner end thereof will be disposed adjacent to the next ratchet tooth on the element 11.

The casing or housing 7 is provided, in its periphery with an opening 15 normally held closed by a cover plate 16.

Extending from the casing 7 in a direction diametrically opposite to the tubular member 5 is a plunger shank 17, which is adapted to be used by the dentist in properly plugging the filling into a tooth.

In operation, the plate 16 is moved so as to uncover the opening 15, and pieces of metal or amalgam to be placed in the tooth are introduced to the pockets 10 in the periphery of the cylinder. When all of the pockets have been filled the door 16 may be closed, and the tool is ready for use. When it is desired to insert one of the fillings in a tooth

the tubular shank is adjusted to the mouth so that the repleced, open end 6 thereof is disposed over the hollow tooth. The knob 14 may then be depressed, whereupon the cylinder 9 is partially rotated. As soon as one of the pockets 10 comes into register with the inner end of the tubular member the filling contained therein will drop into the tubular member and will pass out of the lower end thereof. The article is thus placed in the tooth without resorting to the use of tweezers and other like implements now employed. After the filling has been injected in the tooth, the tool may be reversed and the packing end 17 may be used to properly position the filling in the tooth and to work the same firmly in place.

From the foregoing it is obvious that I have provided a tool which is of extremely simple construction and which is capable of being very easily and quickly manufactured. The cylinder may be provided with more or less filling holding pockets than are shown in the drawings, and it is obvious that a tool equipped with a magazine filling holder of this character will greatly facilitate the work of a dentist. While the present is a disclosure of what is believed to be the preferred embodiment of the invention, it is understood that the invention is not limited thereto, but that various changes in the minor details of construction, proportions and arrangement of parts may be resorted to if desired without departing from the spirit of the invention as defined by the appended claims. I claim. 1. In a dental tool a tubular shank, a cylinder rotatably mounted on said shank and being provided with pockets in its periphery and means for rotating said cylinder to bring the said pockets one at a time into communication with said tubular shank.

2. In a dental tool, a tubular shank, a casing at one end of said shank, a cylinder rotatably mounted in said casing, the said cylinder being provided in its periphery with a plurality of pockets adapted to communicate with said shank, a ratchet wheel, the said ratchet wheel being connected with said cylinder, and an operating rod slidably arranged in said casing and being engaged at one end with the teeth of said ratchet wheel.

3. In a dental tool, a tubular shank, a casing at one end of said shank, a cylinder rotatably mounted in said casing, a ratchet wheel for rotating said cylinder, said cylinder being provided in its periphery with a plurality of spaced pockets adapted to communicate with said tubular member, a rod mounted for longitudinal sliding movement in said casing, one end of said rod being

adapted to engage the teeth of said ratchet wheel, a spring for normally holding said rod out of engagement with the said ratchet teeth, and the opposite end of said rod extending to the exterior of the said casing.

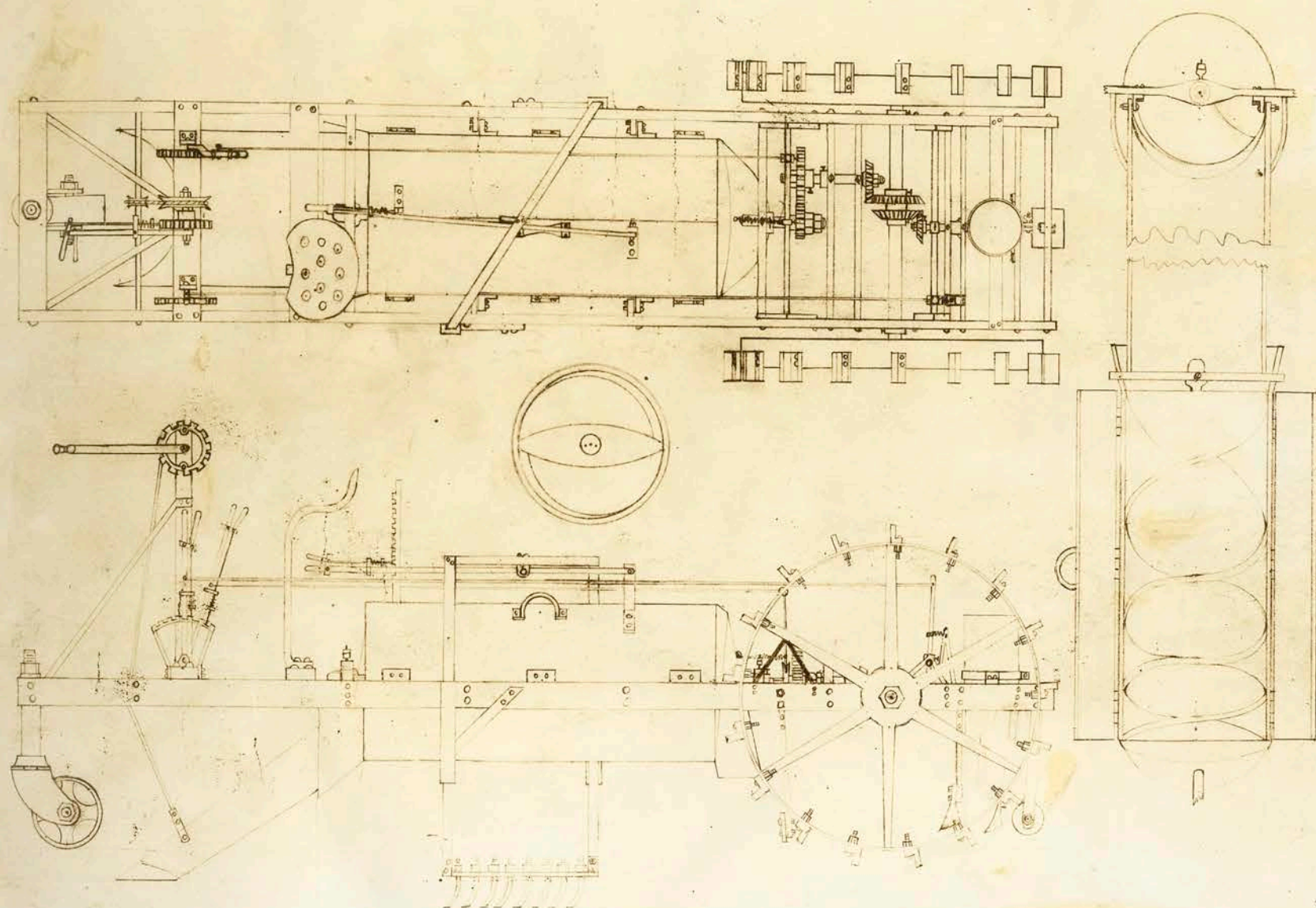

This is to certify that I, Julius W. Johnson, Austin, Travis County, Texas, have drawn various sketches and worked on miniature models of a non-parting sucker rod connection, similar to that of the cut set out in this instrument of descriptive matter for the sole purpose of perfecting same. This connection is to be for sucker Rods in an Oil Well, Water Well, or such like, where wells are to be pumped, Rods are to be used for lifting purposes and being attached to traveling valve at lower end which is operated in a working barrel, or so called pump placed in tubing or in casing in a drilled hole in the ground where fluid is to be drawn to surface.

I have worked on same idea for months and have made various models and sketches. On the tenth day of November, 1942, I had a complete connection made at Rodessa, Louisiana, by the Butler Machine Works and paid for same by check issued on the Continental National Bank, Shreveport, La., in payment of same and do hereby make claim to the above and all descriptive matter set out in this statement as being of my own and sole idea and not copied from any other whatsoever. Up to this instrument, I have not seen or known of such, by or through any person, or persons, who claimed to be working on same, but I have at various times told others that I was coming out with a non-rod-parting section. I did on the second day of November, 1942, enter into a drawing of same with a Machine Shop at Shreveport, Louisiana, with the purpose of having a section made up, but having same priced, I considered it twice too much for such job and did not have it built. The name of Company, I believe, is the Modern Machine Works, located on Highway 141, Shreveport, La., and better described as being directly across highway 141 from main entrance into the Louisiana Iron and Pipe Supply. I herein state that if any claim or letter of right of claim is applied for, by or through the Company, or any part of connections with said Company, that such claim will be copied from my own rights for claim and should be considered a copy of mine; that all right to same should be held by me.

Section One

Section One is the Box connection where the Rod connection screws into at both ends to connect two rods together. O D Box size is same as that of Rod pin as Rods are not of same size but owing to size desired for wells of different depths and different size tubing, pulling load and rod weight in well. The above is figured one and five eighths of inch O D as model sketch, but various sizes are figured as well as lengths. Each end of Box a one inch thread in length is made I D to fit thread on end of rod and made to size Tap as that of Rod. Box has opening extending further into with a direct offset reduced to smaller size to form a shoulder, same being threaded to fit extension on end of Rod where it is screwed into and one fourth of an inch greater in length, so as to start threading first when making up in order to be able to spud onto the main thread more directly as both are being threaded at same turning with wrench and having same amount of thread per inch. When closed to Jam forms a two-way Jam, first at shoulder next to rod end at reduced point where a Lock-washer is placed to be closed down when drawn together. This forms a two-way Jam and Lock-washer lock and is to be made, if desired, a left hand thread in one end and right hand thread in the other to help prevent parting.

Section Two

Section Two is the Rod end to be built on Rods one at each end and both to have this extension, which is my principal claim. This is reduced in O D size to form a shoulder at that point and threaded one fourth of an inch greater in length than that of main thread on Rod section, same cut, where Lock-washer is placed to take up one quarter inch so that when Rod is screwed into Rod Box both shoulders have made connection and Lock-washer is closed to regular size, thus forming a two-way Jam and a Lock-washer lock. The thread is to be on both main thread and extension end, same thread per inch and can be made left hand thread on one end of rod and right hand on other. This is a major part of my claim also, same being made in the Box.

Section Three

The Rod end can be made inter-changeable for old Rods by threading I D as shown on Rod in Cut 3, which shows an opening to be made through entire length of Rod end and threaded to Tap, same as that of Rod thread, Cut 3. When Rod is screwed into Rod end it forms same as that of Cut 2 built on new Rods.

Old Rods are inter-changeable for Rod ends by cutting off both ends and arranging same, as shown in Cut 3, by threading same as that of Rod end, Cut 2.

Section Four

Section Four shows all connections closed to Jam point. It also shows direct Jam connection as designated by arrow when completely closed by bringing Lock-washer to closed size. This can be seen by noting Cut One and Two.

The above Cuts One, Two, Three and Four are of my own and individual idea and has not been copied from any such section or connections by or through disposition of any individuals, or persons and is a part of the descriptive matter as set out in two separate sheets, numbering One and Two. I hereby claim all the above rights to be of my own and personal affair, the same as that of my filing with the United States Patent Office, Washington, D.C.

DISCLOSURE OF INVENTION - A DISPENSING DEVICE

ROY L. HAYNES, INVENTOR

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On this the 15th day of September, 1948, before me appeared Roy L. Haynes, a citizen of the United States of America, and a resident of Austin, Travis County, Texas, who declares that he is the inventor and originator of a dispensing device described herein which he has disclosed and explained to me.

This disclosure has been made to me this day for the purpose of assisting in bringing the below-described device to a commercial stage.

This invention is a device and method for dispensing chemical crystals, powder, paste, liquid or any readily flowing substance, for example table salt, tooth paste, oil paint, or shaving cream. The device may be made of metal, plastics, or similar material. It may be attached in the usual and well-known manner, such as screwing, or made a part of a container of any suitable material of any desired shape or form, for example, a lead or tinfoil tube well known to the art.

This invention operates from slight pressure by the fingers on a movable cap which slides downward to a proper position so the material in the container can be dispensed in the amount desired through an opening in the movable cap; said opening closes and the flow of the material or substance is stopped when the finger pressure on said cap or cover is released, the cap moving back to its original position due to a spring action.

A better understanding of the operation of the device and dispensing method can be obtained by referring to the following numbered drawings:

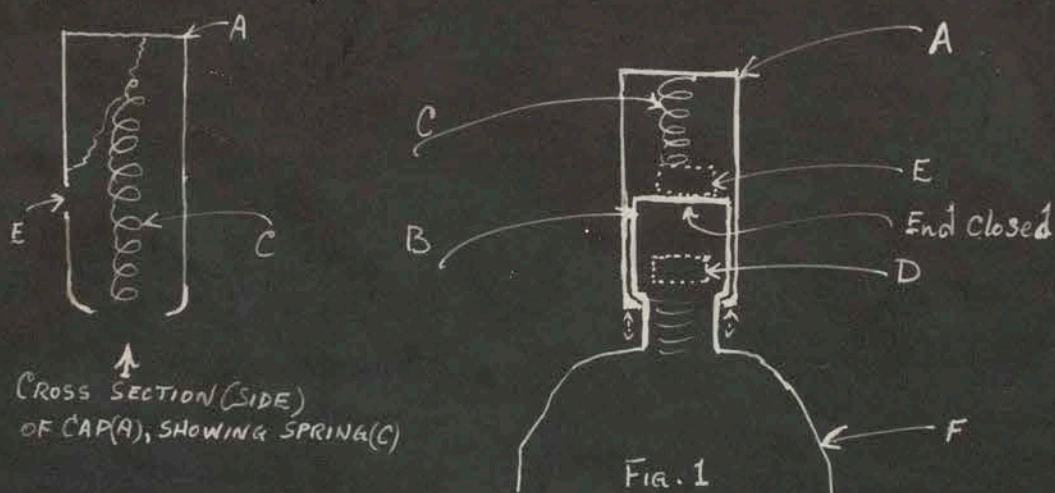


Fig. 1. Cap or cover (A) which fits over section (B), slides downward by pressure of the fingers until the holes D and E coincide, cap (A) moving back to original position by pressure from spring (C). When holes D and E coincide, the substance in the container (F) can be poured or shaken out, or if in a pliable metal tube, the substance therein may be forced out by gripping with the hand or fingers. When pressure on cap (A) is released, the spring (C) action returns it to original position thus moving hole (E) upward and closing hole (D) by a solid section of cap (A) and preventing flow of substance from the container. Cap A and section B are constructed so that cap A remains on the device in the desired position, being grooved and shaped for this purpose.

The dispensing device may be screwed on or made a part of the container (F) itself.










AUTO REAR-WARNING DEVICE

Noise device attached to rear of automobile to warn children and pedestrians of rear movement of vehicle. Device gives off an intermittent "buzz" or similar noise of such volume that those persons within the "danger area" of the automobile are warned in time to move to a safe position. The device is controlled by the reverse gearshift lever in that when the automobile gearshift is placed in reverse position this "Auto Rear-Warning Device" starts its operation, and the device's operation stopped whenever the gearshift is moved into any other position. It is, of course, easily possible to have an electrical switch attached to the dashboard also for elimination of the device's operation whenever such is desired. On the 1950 Pontiac I drive, the rear backup lights go into automatic operation whenever I place my hydramatic in reverse and I would like one of these devices myself to attach to the rear section of my automobile and make a connection onto one of the backup lights.

I do believe a device such as this one will meet with market approval because many people, myself included, are faced with the ever present danger of harming our children or pedestrians when our automobiles are in movement to the rear, with its extremely limited visibility, and this device, emitting a noise to be heard within a fifteen or twenty foot distance, will not only warn those persons subject to possible harm, but will be heard by the driver and remind him that due caution must be taken. Present day automobiles are simply too quiet in their operation to attract persons to their rearward movement and complete reliance of such persons on the skill and caution of the driver is not enough. Occasionally, we read of a child being run over in the driveway of a home, due strickly to the neglect on the part of the driver, and I believe a device such as this "Auto Rear-Warning Device" will be welcomed by many parents and others who must operate their vehicles in areas where children may be.

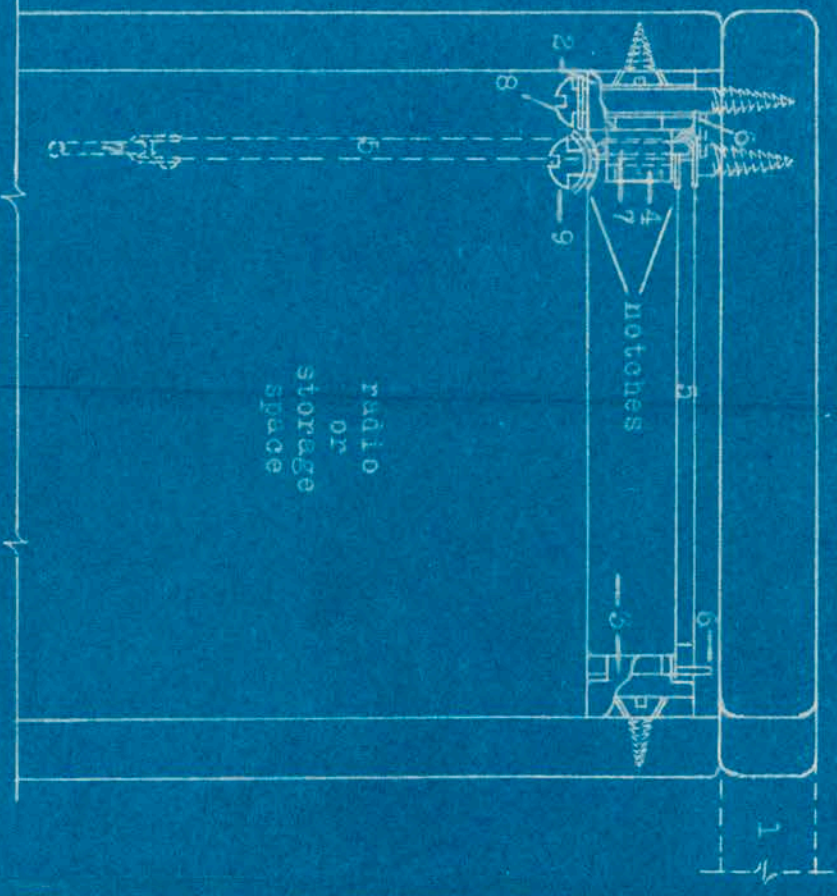


Fig. F - Right end view

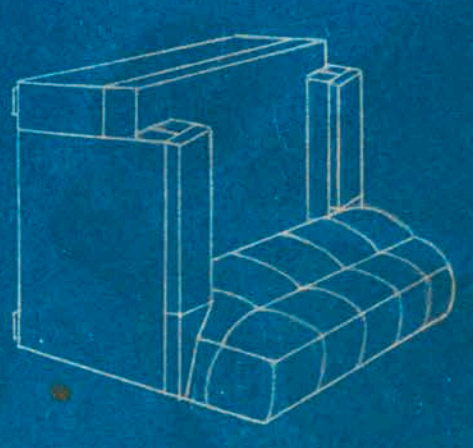

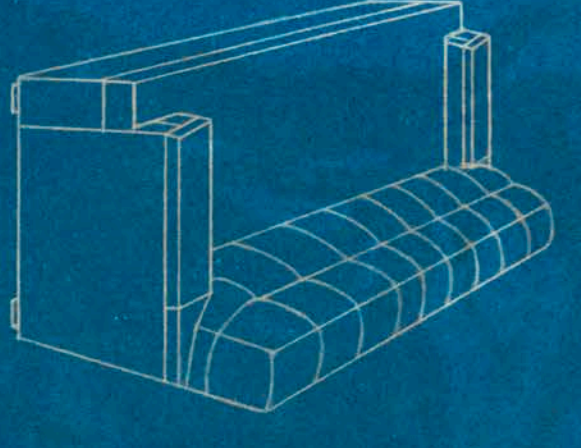

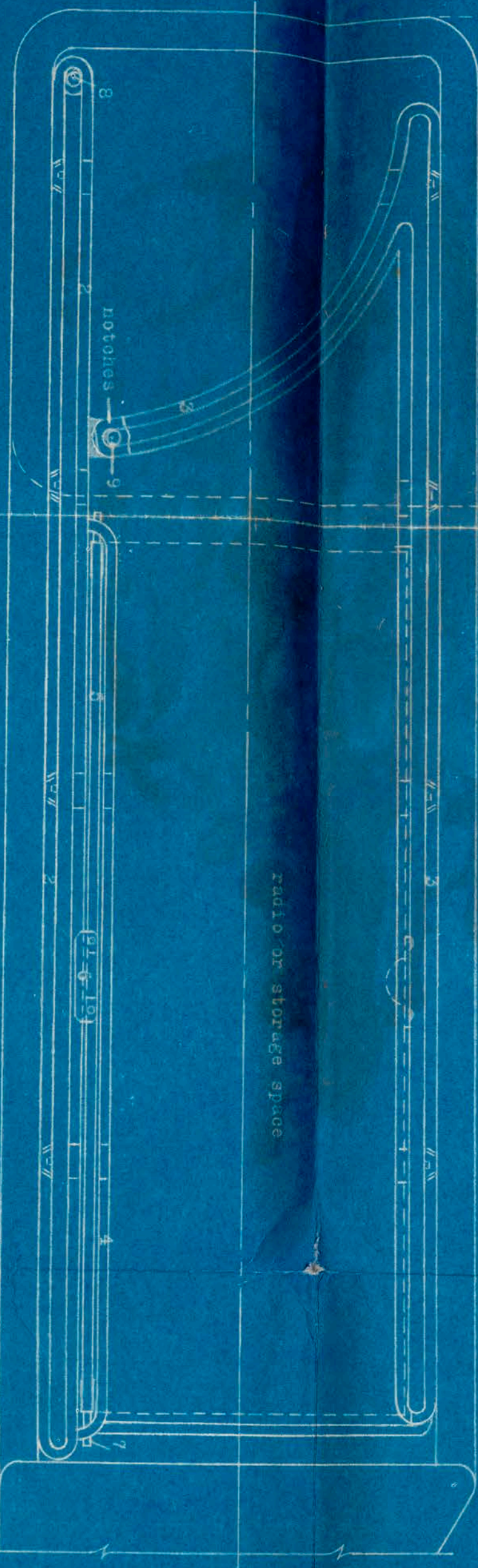


Fig. D - top view

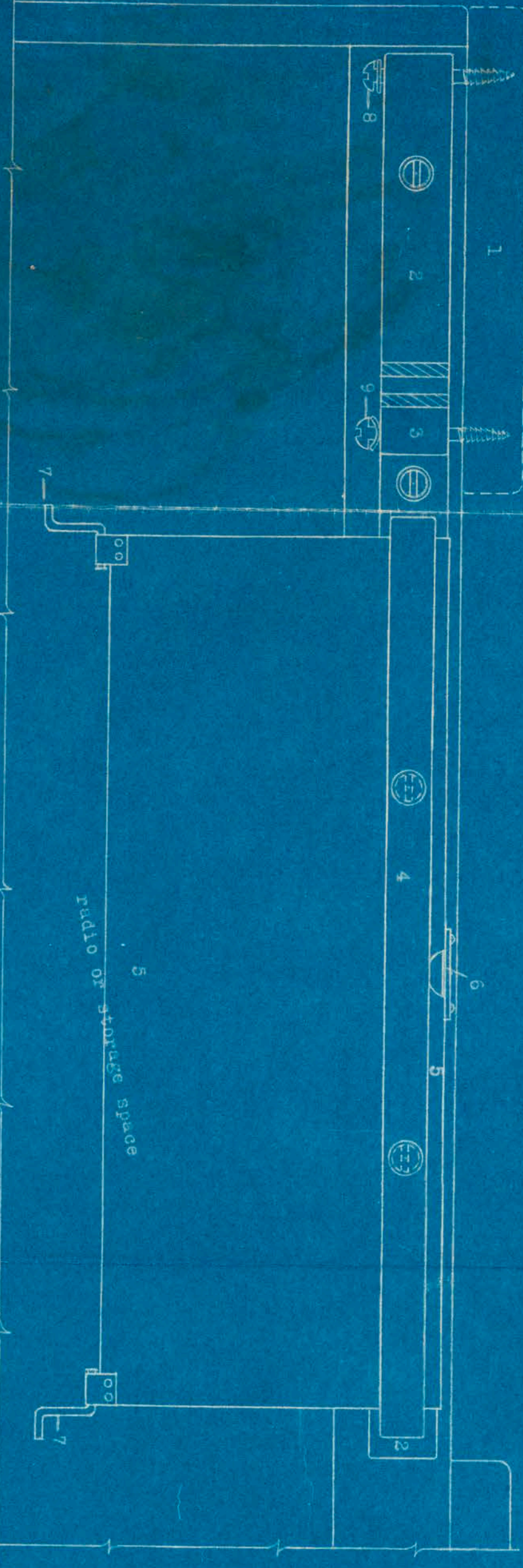


Fig. E - Inside left-hand view
through cut-section XY

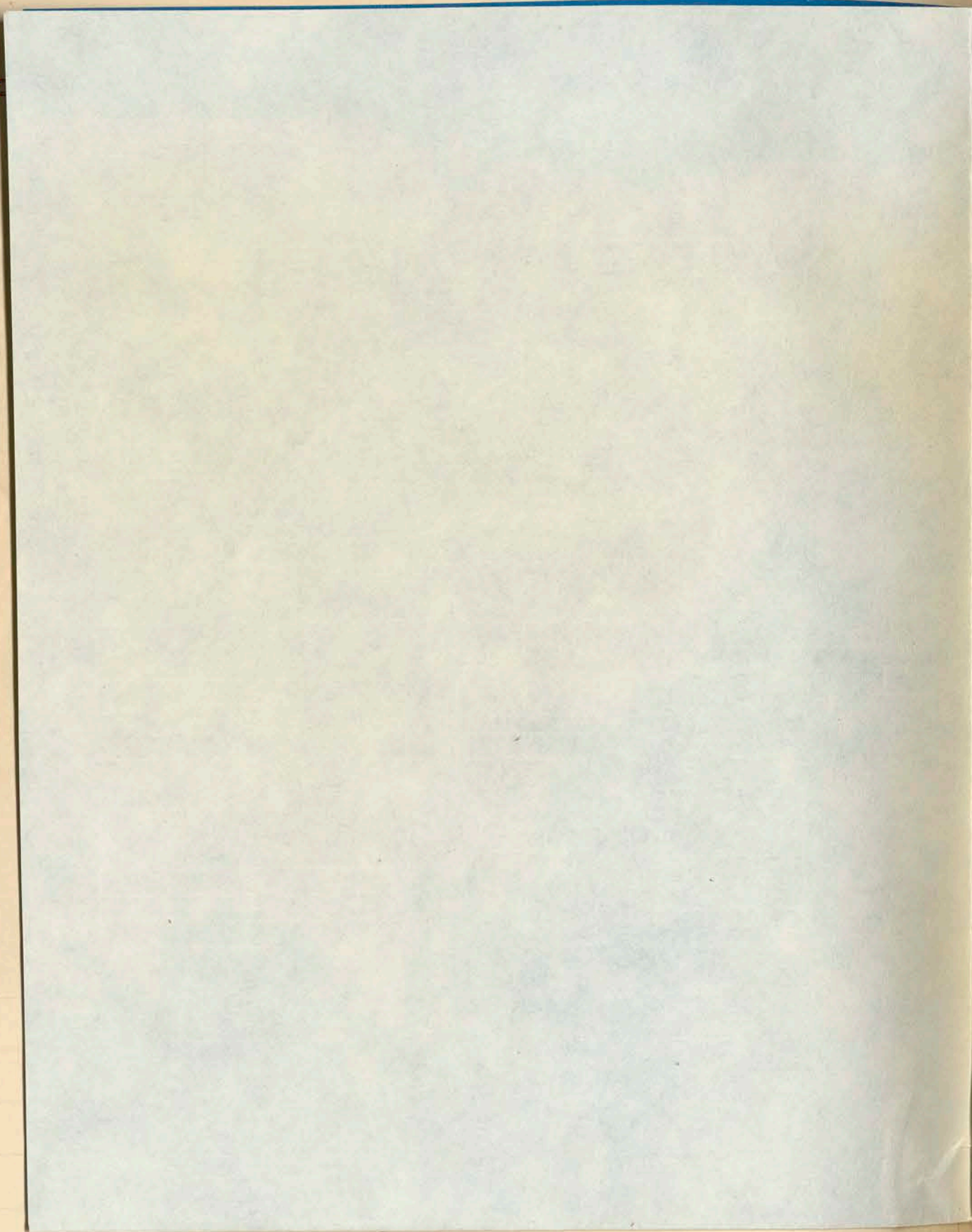
I, Lloyd W. Gunn, Jr., of Austin, Travis County, Texas, have invented a special new novel, and useful device for the arm rests of sofas, chairs and etc. which are specially constructed so that they may be used as a storage space (for knitting or other materials, books, radios, phonographs, TV remote control unit, or etc.), which is easy to enter by sliding the top section of the arm rest forward, and/or this top section may not be pivoted across the front of the sofa or chair to form a table for magazines, sewing, painting, any number of other uses, and especially as a snack table or inner table to eat from while watching television. A disappearing tray may be pulled up to extend over the opening in the arm rest so that hot plates, glasses or bottles that might leave circles of staining, or etc. may be placed on this level surface. The invention described herein is especially useful in that it can be built into modern or any other type or style of furniture without disrupting from its style or beauty in the least. The construction and operation is as follows: FIG. A & B show the sofa and chair in normal appearance. FIG. C & D show the sofa and chair with their arm rest sections slid out to their forward pull-out positions (which exposes any of the many things which may be contained or placed in the hollow arm rests). FIG. E & F show the arm rests sections pivoted across the sofa or chair (one or both or the chair arm rest sections may be moved out, but only one needs to be pivoted - enough space remains between the ends of the sections of the sofa when in table position (FIG. C & D) to allow persons to move in and out of the sofa without interfering with the arm rest sections). FIG. G & H show the top view of the sofa and/or chair left arm rest (left of sitting position) with the sliding arm rest section (1) removed (dotted line - in pivoted table position (FIG. C & D)). The mechanism of this invention consists mainly of two double guide tracks - the left guide track (2) and the right guide track (3). The left guide track (2) consists of a metal or plastic strip bent so that it forms a straight double parallel track that should be glued at one (or both) ends. A metal (or plastic) strip of lesser width, is attached in position to the left guide track (2) and becomes a part thereof. This is the tray retainer track (4). The right guide track (3) is also bent to form parallel tracks which are also straight except for a section at their outer ends which is bent into a semi-circular arch (as shown). The end of this arch is attached to the side of the left guide track (2) (by electric spot or attachment screws or etc.). Holes, slightly larger than the heads of the the right guide track (3) and counter-sink holes in the inside section of the tray retainer track (4) and counter-sink holes in the outer section of the tray retainer track (4) are necessary (four on each shown here). The combined a left-hand arm rest (on your left when sitting) of a sofa and/or chair or be used on both the right and left arm rests. To use in a right-hand arm rest, the track unit is merely turned over so that the left guide track (2) is (always) towards the outer side of the sofa and/or chair arm rest. The arm rest tray (5) consists of a flat section of plastic, wood, metal or etc. and when not in use (or when the interior of the hollow arm rest is being used), it hangs down between the left guide track (2) and the tray retainer track (4) and the top edge is held from dropping through the tracks of a thin metal or plastic pull plate (6), which extends slightly over the edge of the left guide track (2). This pull plate (6) is fastened to the tray (5) over when making the tray (5). To prevent the tray (5) from being removed completely from the tray (5). The tray (5) is fastened to the tray (5) over bent retainer rods (7) have been placed in operators attached to the bottom ends of the tray (5). When the tray (5) is raised upward as far as necessary track (4), and since they turn freely in their operators, they retain their position as the tray (5) is left across the opening in the arm rest, and is notched and lowered at top and bottom so as to reveal the tray (5) when the track unit is turned over for the other arm rest (see FIG. D, E, & F). The sliding arm rest top (1) is placed on the arm rest (see FIG. D, E, & F) (FIG. G & H - dotted lines in FIG. D, E, & F), the left guide screw (8) is placed up through and near the outer end of the left guide track (2) (from the bottom), and screwed (force presser, bradawl, or etc.) into the under side of the sliding arm rest top (1), and the right guide screw (9) is placed up through the right guide track (2), near the end of the bent section, and bottom (and top) for use when track unit is turned over for the other arm rest) of the right guide track (2) near the end of the bent section, and a spring-like washer which has been placed over the right guide screw (9). This holds the sliding arm rest top (1) in table position (FIG. C & D) and (1) is pushed outward until a little pressure is used. Once the (1) is pushed outward in an arc (FIG. C & D) to its pull-out position (FIG. B & F). This is brought about by the end of the right guide screw (8) having been bent into a segment of an imaginary circle with the left guide screw (9) as its center. Now that the sliding arm rest top (1) is in the pull-out position (FIG. B & F), with the right guide screw (9) having traveled through the bent section of the right guide track (2) to the start of the said tracks straight section, the arm rest top (1) is merely slid back to its normal position (FIG. A & D), and the guide screws (8 & 9) back to the inner ends of the guide tracks (2 & 3).

CONTINUATION and ADDITIONAL DESIGNS for the
COMBINATION SNACK-BAR and CONTAINER
ARM RESTS for SOFAS and CHAIRS

I, Lloyd W. Gunn, Jr. of Austin, Travis County, Texas, have invented several new, useful, and improved additions to my original Combination Snack Bar and Container Arm Rests for Sofas and Chairs design, and also two other designs to accomplish primarily the same thing in a different manner, i.e., to have the arm rests of sofas, chairs, and other furniture specially constructed so as to conform to any and all types and styles of furniture without distracting from its beauty, and yet to quickly and easily turn and/or open to form a table section for holding magazines, sewing, painting, writing, and any number of other uses, and especially as a snack or dinner table to eat from while watching television. Once the table section is open, the hollow arm rests may be used as a storage space for knitting (or other materials), books, radios, phonographs, TV remote control unit, or etc. The constructions and operations are as follows: Figs. 1a show the most simple new design; that of a divided, folding arm rest section, which is hinged to open inward to form a flat, broad (twice the width of the arm rest in normal position), hard surface (no fear of hot plates, stains, spills, or wear damage). However, one must sit at an angle, and make use of the table section from the side. A more preferable method is to combine the divided, folding arm rest with another mechanism, such as with the arm rest which slides out and pivots across the front of the chair or sofa (fully shown and described in my original drawing), and then opens on its hinges to form a flat, broad, hard surface table. (Fig. 1b & 1c) Figs. 2a, 2b & 2c show another design which uses no tracks, but instead pivots inward across the chair or sofa by means of a single bolt, rod, or etc. located in the bottom section of the outer end of the arm rest (Fig. 2b, 2d & 2e) The bolt (or screw) is countersunk in the bottom arm rest section and fastened thru the chair or sofa frame work. (Fig. 2d) The rod is placed in like manner, with a pin thru it and in a groove or hole in the lower arm section and another pin thru the rod under the frame work. A washer (or roller bearing) may be placed between the pivoting arm section and the frame. Again, the pivoted arm rest may be solid, or preferably combined with the divided, folding arm rests so that they may be opened inward on their hinges to form a broad, flat, hard surface. (Fig. 2c) (The arm rests can open outward without pivoting, but if it is desired to have them open inward (as in Fig. 1a) and to pivot also, the bolt, rod, screw, or etc. used as a pivot, should be placed further from the end of the arm rest, so that when in pivoted position, the divided, folding arm rest may open outward and still be supported by the arm rest frame.) Fig. 3a, 3b & 3c show another different design to form a table section from an arm rest. Fig. 3a & 3d show the arm rests in normal position with the two-sectional table extension folded up. Fig. 3b & 3e show the folded table sections lowered by hinges to its half opened position, and Fig. 3c and 3f show the table sections completely opened and extended out over the sofa and/or chair to form a broad, flat, hard surface. (Extra strength should not be needed, but if it is, flat metal strips with slots at each end may be fastened to the sides of the folding sections to bridge the openings between each section.) The broad, flat, hard surfaces of all the above designs, may be painted, covered with plastic or wood-grain decal, or otherwise finished for a more pleasing appearance. When once folded up, a simple pressure or other type catch will hold all the table sections securely in normal position.

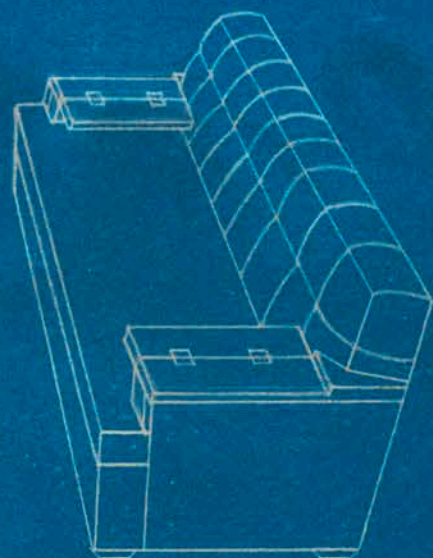

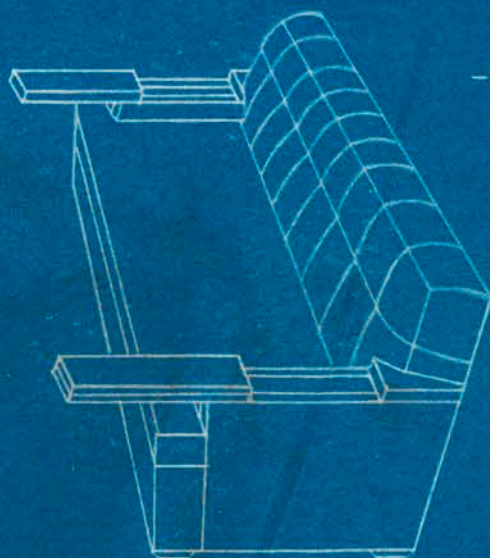

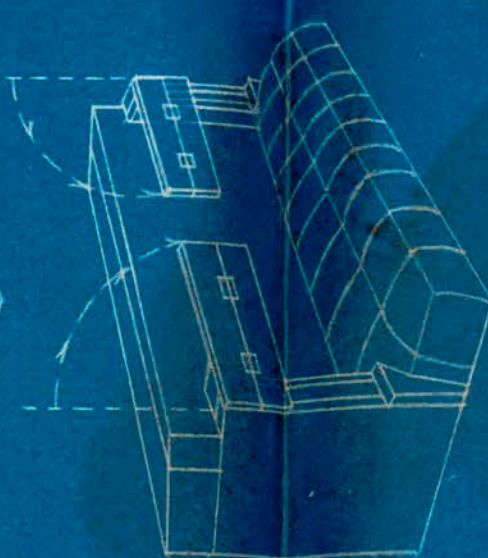

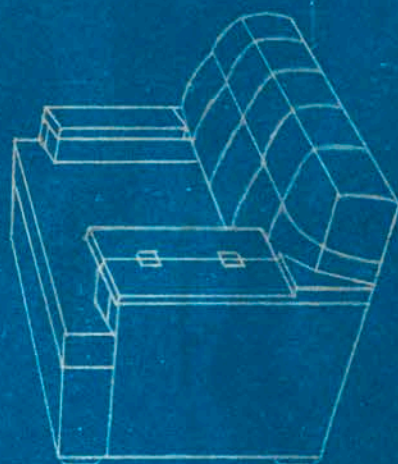

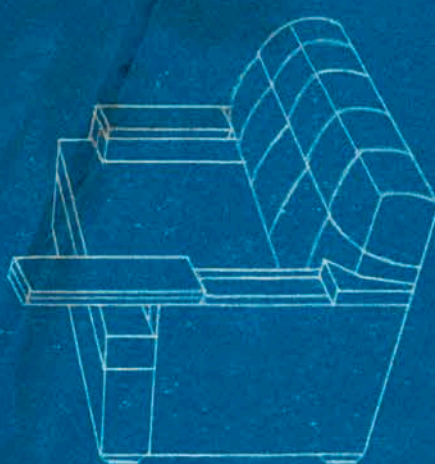

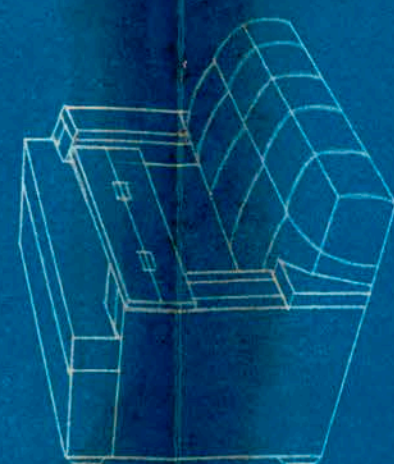

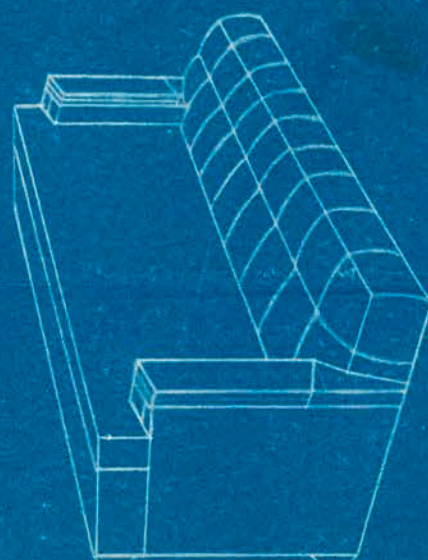

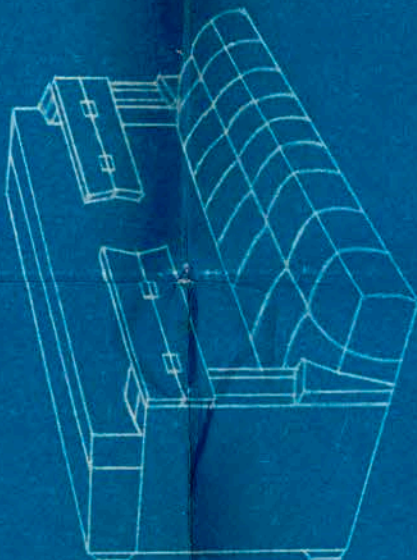

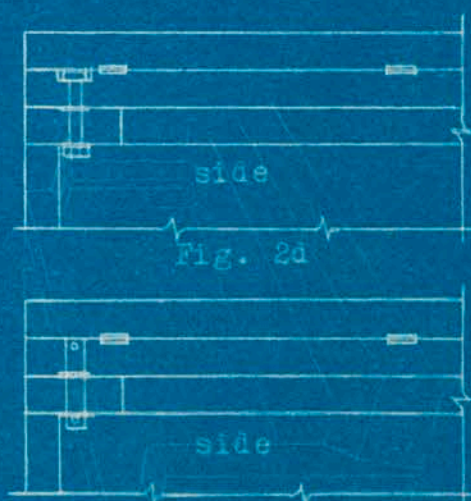

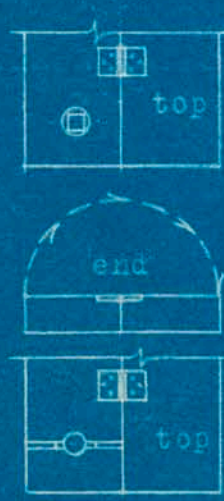

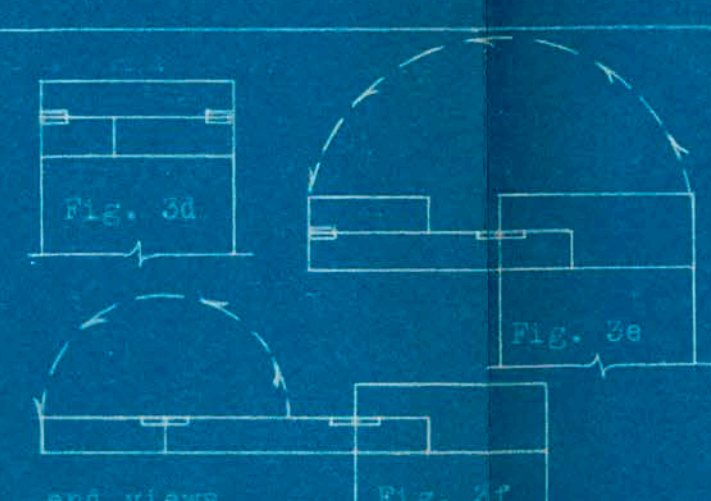

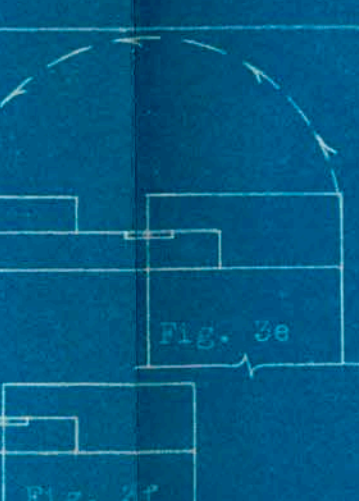

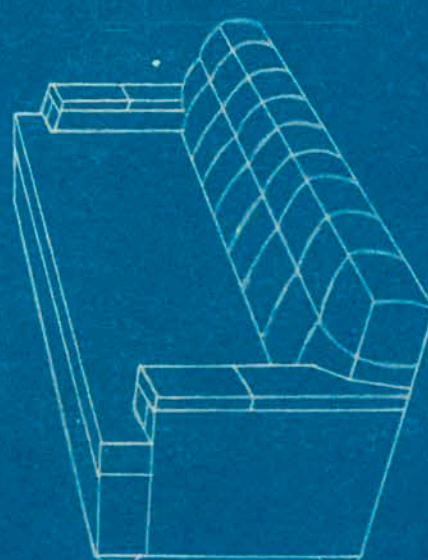

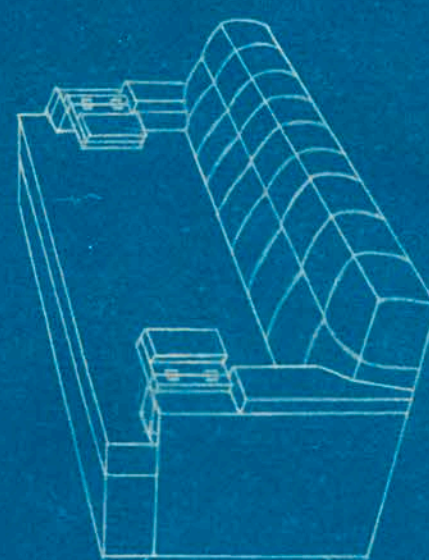

To Whom It may concern:

Take Notice: That pursuant to and by virtue of the authority vested in it by the Statutes of the State of Texas; Chapter 160, General Laws of Texas, Acts of the 36th Legislature, and after public hearings duly had upon motion of the Commission, notice of such hearings having been duly given in the manner provided by law and after investigations made by said Commission covering substantially all parts of the State, the Industrial Welfare Commission finds, and hereby decrees that the lowest wage paid females and minors should not be less than the amounts hereinafter set forth, subject to the conditions hereinafter named. The Industrial Welfare Commission of the State of Texas does hereby order that:

Experienced Female Workers and Minors:

1. No person, firm or corporation shall employ, or suffer or permit any female, or minor to be employed in any Telephone or Telegraph office, Mercantile Establishment, Laundry or Factory (except as otherwise provided in this order) at a rate of wage less than 25¢ per hour or \$12.00 per week of forty-eight hours, all-time in excess of forty eight hours per week to be paid for at proportional rates. Any female shall be deemed experienced when she has been employed in any occupation one year.

A minor shall be deemed experienced when he or she has been employed in any occupation one year.

A minor within the meaning of Chapter 160, General Laws of Texas Acts of the 36th Legislature is any person under 15 years of age of either sex.

Learners.

2. No person, firm or corporation shall employ or suffer or permit to be employed any female or minor as a learner in any Telephone or Telegraph office, Mercantile Establishment, Laundry or Factory at a rate of wages less than the rate fixed for experienced workers, except at the rates and under the conditions hereinafter set forth:

Women and minors employed as learners must be paid at a rate of not less than 15¢ per hour for the first six months of employment and not less than 20¢ per hour for the second six months employment. The period of one year for learners will be determined by the time such learner has been employed by a person, firm or corporation, and not by the time of the taking effect of this Order. All time of learners in excess of eight hours per day or forty eight hours per week must be paid for at proportional rates.

Part Time Workers.

3. Regularly employed part-time workers, either experienced, or learners, must be registered with the Commission, by furnishing it with the following information: Name, age, sex (if minor) address, number of hours worked per week, rate of pay, and if a minor under 15 years of age, the date of work permit and the name of the county judge issuing such permit, such information to be furnished the Commission within two weeks after such part-time worker is employed.

Any person, firm or corporation may employ students attending accredited Universities, colleges, vocational, continuation or cooperative schools as part-time workers on special permits from the Commission.

Deficients

4. Any person, firm or corporation may employ any female or minor who is mentally or physically deficient and who is unable to earn the minimum rate of pay herein provided, at a rate of less than the amount of said minimum, provided, that a permit is secured from the Commission which may be issued upon the receipt of information setting out: The name, age, sex (if a minor) nature of deficiency, nature of employment and the number of hours employed per day, provided that at no time shall the special licenses exceed ten percent of the total number of employees in said industry. Any such licenses may be renewed for a like period of six months. The Commission to fix the rate of pay in cases where deficients are employed. ~~The~~ All deficients to be registered with the Commission within two weeks after employment.

Piece Workers.

5. Any person, firm or corporation employing females or minors in any Telephone or Telegraph office, Mercantile Establishment, Laundry or Factory on a piece work basis, must pay such female or minor a piece work rate sufficient to enable such female or minor to earn the minimum rate per forty eight hour week.

Meals
 b. These meals are furnished by any person, firm or corporation employing females or minors, in any Telephone or Telegraph office, Mercantile Establishment, Laundry or factory in this State not more than 20¢ per meal may be deducted from the pay of such female or minor.

Rules.
 The following rules for the guidance of employers of females and minors becomes effective simultaneously with the taking effect of the minimum scale of wages hereinbefore fixed for females and minors:

- (a) Every person, firm or corporation employing females or minors in any Telephone or Telegraph office, Mercantile Establishment, Laundry or factory shall furnish to the Commission, at its request, any and all reports or information which the Commission may require for carrying out the purposes of the Act creating the Commission. Such reports or information to be verified by the oath of the person, member of the firm, or the president, secretary or manager of the corporation furnishing the same if and when so requested by the Commission.
- (b) Every person, firm or corporation shall keep an accurate register of all females and minors employed, giving name, age and sex (if a minor) hours worked and wages paid, and such register shall be at all times open to the Commission or any of its duly authorized representatives.
- (c) For the purpose of making inspections of, or extracts from, all books, reports, contracts, payrolls, documents or papers of such persons, firms or corporations, relating to the employment of females or minors, or payment thereof, shall be subject to inspection by the Commission or any of its duly authorized representatives.
- (d) The Commission shall exercise exclusive jurisdiction over all questions arising as to the administration or interpretation of this order.

This Order shall become effective and be in force on and after February 7th, 1921.

Nothing in this order shall prevent any employer from paying more than the minimum or least rate fixed by the

Commission.

Commissions, Bonuses or Tips will not be considered part of the wage or salary of females or minors.

The Commission may upon sixty days notice, amend, change, rescind or supplement this Order, or any part thereof.

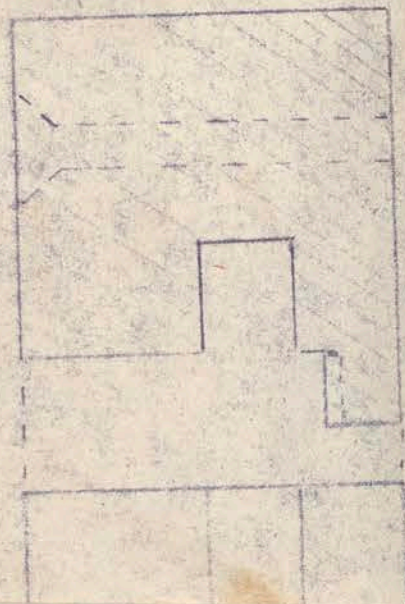

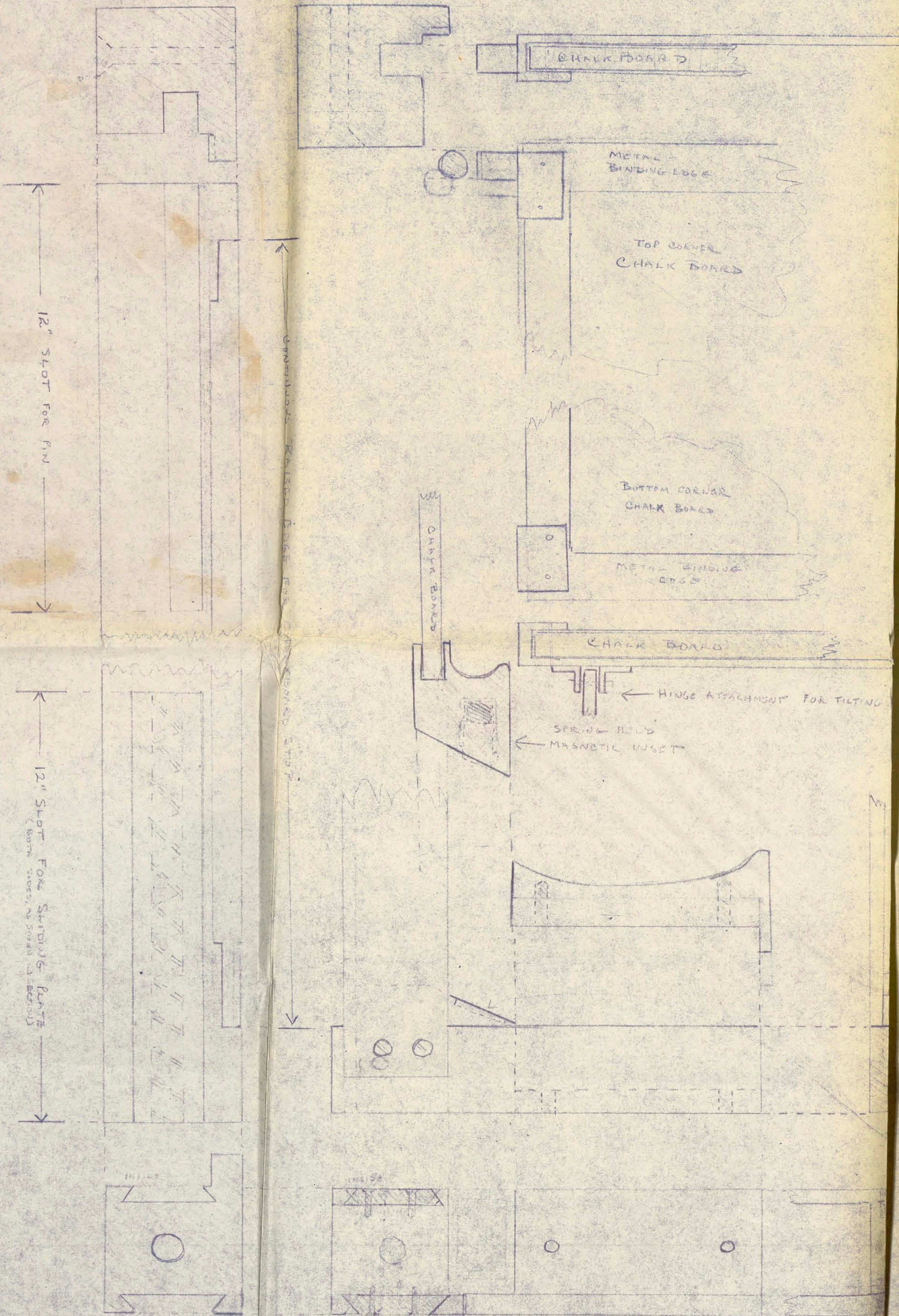
